Dear [Parent]:

This is in response to your June 22, 2000, complaint form to this Office in which you allege that the Fort Bragg Schools violated the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) when it failed to provide you access to your son's education records in response to your requests. This Office administers FERPA, which addresses issues that pertain to education records.

FERPA gives parents the right to have access to their minor children's education records, the right to seek to have the records amended, and the right to have some control over the disclosure of information from the records. Education records are defined as those records that contain information directly related to a student and which are maintained by an educational agency or institution or a party acting for the agency or institution.

FERPA is applicable to educational agencies or institutions that receive funding under most programs administered by the U.S. Department of Education. 34 CFR § 99.1. The school your child attends is a "DOD Section 6 school," which means it is funded solely by the Department of Defense under 10 U.S.C. section 2164, and not from program appropriations administered by the Department of Education. Accordingly, FERPA does not apply to your son's education records that are maintained by the DOD School.
